### **Our Student Awards**

The Crawford Fund's mission is to increase Australia's engagement in international agricultural research, development and education for the benefit of developing countries and Australia.

As part of our efforts to support and encourage the next generation in study, careers and volunteering in international agricultural research, the Crawford Fund proudly supports our Student Awards.

The Student Awards, open to tertiary students in all States and Territories, usually see the successful recipients travel to a host country to research and explore their chosen topic areas in international agricultural projects and gain valuable practical experience on the ground in developing countries.

Many of our successful Awardees will be partnered with projects through the Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research (ACIAR) and international agricultural research centres.

## Diverse and rewarding experiences

The topics covered and countries visited by our past Student Award recipients have been many and varied. The rewarding projects our most recent Student Award winners have been involved in cover diverse commodities including banana, cassava, chickpea, cattle, finfish, pigs, poultry, sheep, trees, vegetables and wheat.

The topics they have covered include climate smart agriculture; livestock disease risk management; food security and childhood malnutrition; carbon sequestration in tropical soils; diversifying smallholder livelihoods; forest and landscape restoration; improving maternal and childhood nutrition; ecological control of liver fluke; and unlocking the future potential of the edible insect sector for aquaculture, poulty and livestock!

Countries travelled to include Cambodia, Costa Rica, Fiji, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Laos, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Philippines, Samoa, Timor-Leste and Vietnam.

Students from the previous rounds of Awards have shared their experiences, challenges and highlights through the Crawford Fund network, including those following:
