

Indonesia ranks third among Southeast Asian countries, following Thailand and Vietnam.





INDONESIAN DAIRY SECTOR

Four provinces are the main dairy producers (based on dairy cattle population in 2024)





- Mostly smallholder farmers: 99% reside in Java Island (BPS, 2024)
- Milk is primarily sold to dairy cooperatives
- Domestic demand for dairy products > domestic supply = import 80% milk



IndoDairy project

(ACIAR funded project: AGB/2012/099)

- 2016 2021
- 600 (baseline) and 480 (endline) dairy farmers from 5 dairy coops in 4 districts in West Java Province



Participatory approach

- Extension interventions:
 - o Discussion Groups (incl Women DG) and
 - o Focus Farms



Gender-sensitive technology

- mastitis testing using detergent or 'surf' test
- teat-dipping after milking
- farm business management







1000 SRIKANDI

ADB funded Project (2021 - 2022)

- Inspired by Women only Discussion Groups in IndoDairy
- Included 1000 women dairy farmers from 6 districts in West Java Province
- Promoting gender inclusive extension services by providing hands - on training tailored for women farmers:
 - o Dairy best management practice
 - o Dairy financial literacy
